Dear Friends of Scotforth Road

My name is Revd Yvonne J Pearson and as I will be sharing care of you while Revd Linda is on Sabbatical I thought a bit of an introduction might be helpful. I may have met some of you when I have led your service on a Sunday a couple of times but hope that this will give you a little bit more about who I am and where I've come from.

My husband, Pete, and myself moved into Grimsargh about 18 months ago. I am a supernumerary minister who retired from the Dane & Trent Circuit as their Superintendent. I worked with Revd Linda in the Chester & Stoke District before she came to you, and so we chose to link ourselves to your Circuit. Pete and I have six children between us and that's what brought us back to Lancashire. They are spread over Darwen, Leyland, Preston, Cottam and my daughter and family are in Cornwall.
